THIS AGREEMENT made the 13th day of February, 2018, by and between **Blanco County**, hereinafter referred to as "CLIENT", with a correctional facility located at 400 South Hwy 281, Johnson City, TX 78636 and **Lone Star Commissary LLC**, hereinafter referred to as "Lone Star Commissary", with home offices located at 319A State Hwy 75 North Huntsville, Texas 77320 for provision of commissary services to one (1) adult correctional facility located in the State of Texas at the following location:

Blanco County Sheriff's Office 400 South Hwy 281

Johnson City, TX 78636

WHEREAS, CLIENT desires to avail itself of LONE STAR COMMISSARY services, and WHEREAS, LONE STAR COMMISSARY desires to provide commissary services for CLIENT, now herefore, in consideration of the mutual covenants and agreements hereinafter set forth, the parties, intending to be legally bound, hereby agree as follows:

I. <u>CLIENT'S GRANT TO LONE STAR COMMISSARY</u>

CLIENT grants unto Lone Star Commissary, as an independent contractor, the exclusive right to sell commissary products to inmates in the above referenced jail.

II. LONE STAR COMMISSARY'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- A.) Pursuant to the provisions of the Agreement, Lone Star Commissary will purchase, and maintain at high standards of quality, such mutually agreed number and type of inventory items at mutually agreed locations for the sales of food products, non-alcoholic beverages, and other such articles and will keep the inventory adequately serviced and supplied with appropriate merchandise in good quality. Lone Star commissary warrants that prices are subject to ordinary price increases that might, from time to time be necessary due to market factors beyond the control of Lone Star Commissary, during the term of this contract.
- B.) Lone Star Commissary agrees to comply with all applicable Federal, State and Local laws and regulations.

Lone Star Commissary guarantees that all equipment installed will be new or like new and have the approval of the local health offices and that the equipment will meet the specifications published by the United States Public Health Federation and National Sanitation Foundation.
- B.) It is hereby agreed that CLIENT assumes no responsibility whatsoever for any damage to the equipment while on its premises, unless the equipment is willfully abused or misused.

IV. INDEMNIFICATION

- A.) Lone Star Commissary shall defend and indemnify CLIENT and its agents, employees, and representatives against any and all suits, actions, claims, demands, damages or losses caused by Lone Star Commissary's acts or omissions or the acts or omissions of Lone Star Commissary's agents, employees or affiliates, arising out of this Agreement; provided, however, that nothing contained herein shall require Lone Star Commissary to defend or indemnify CLIENT for losses, damages, injuries or death arising out of the negligence of CLIENT, its agents or employees.
- B.) Lone Star Commissary's obligation to defend and hold CLIENT harmless pursuant to the agreement shall be dependent upon CLIENT promptly notifying Lone Star Commissary in writing of any such claims or lawsuits against either Lone Star Commissary or CLIENT, but in no event not later than thirty (30) days after the date CLIENT first receives notification.

V. MENUS AND SERVICE SPECIFICATIONS:

- A.) CLIENT and Lone Star Commissary will mutually agree on prices and service specification.
- B.) Lone Star Commissary will provide and install software on one computer for commissary services, provide training, and insure all aspects of software is ready to submit order.

VI. <u>LICENSES</u>, PERMITS AND TAXES:

Lone Star Commissary will be responsible for all federal, state and local license, taxes and permits in connection with the commissary it provides for CLIENT, except that Lone Star Commissary will have no liability for real estate or other taxes levied on property or equipment owned by CLIENT.

VII. <u>INSURANCE:</u>

Lone Star Commissary agrees to provide Workmen's Compensation, Comprehensive (including Product Liability), Bodily Injury and Property Damage Liability Insurance for the mutual protection of CLIENT and Lone Star Commissary. Lone Star Commissary will furnish to CLIENT certificates of insurance indicating that such coverage is in effect, and will annually furnish to CLIENT, certificates of insurance indicating that such coverage is in effect and there has been no lapse of coverage.

VIII. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

A.) Lone Star Commissary will be reimbursed on a weekly basis from monies generated from the Inmate Trust Fund. This responsibility is to be monitored by CLIENT. Outstanding balances greater than 30 days may be subject to interest at the rate in effect on September 1 of the fiscal year in which the payment becomes overdue. The rate in effect on September 1 is equal to the sum of:

- (1) one percent; and
- (2) the prime rate as published in the Wall Street Journal on the first day of July of the preceding fiscal year that does not fall on a Saturday or Sunday.
- B.) Lone Star Commissary shall pay CLIENT' Inmate Trust Fund a fixed rate of return commission. The commission check will be due by the Monday following the week Lone Star Commissary is reimbursed for the prior week's activity for all invoices paid by CLIENT. The commission to be paid to the Inmate Trust Fund shall be 15 % of the sum of Total Gross Sales (inclusive of Sales Tax) less:
 - 1. Sales Tax
 - 2. U.S. Postage
 - 3. Postage Products
 - 4. Phone Cards
 - 5. Tobacco Products

CLIENT and Lone Star Commissary may agree that CLIENT can deduct its commission from the weekly amounts due Lone Star Commissary.

IX. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR RELATIONSHIP:

It is mutually understood and agreed, and it is the intent of the parties that Lone Star Commissary is an independent contractor and employees of Lone Star Commissary are not nor shall they be deemed to be employees of CLIENT and, employees of CLIENT are not nor shall they be deemed to be employees of Lone Star Commissary.

X. LONE STAR COMMISSARY TITLE TO SOFTWARE & HARDWARE

- A.) All software installed by Lone Star Commissary pursuant to the provisions of this Agreement are and shall at all times remain the property of Lone Star Commissary, with title vested in Lone Star Commissary, and CLIENT shall have no property interest in said software. CLIENT agrees to permit only employees and agents of Lone Star Commissary to remove, open, copy, or tamper with said software of Lone Star Commissary. There shall be no unauthorized copies or modifications made to the software without the expressed written consent by an officer of Lone Star Commissary.
- B.) All Maintenance, Repair, or Replacement of software shall be the responsibility of Lone Star Commissary under normal operating conditions. Lone Star Commissary will not be responsible if the software is abused or used for other purposes other than commissary functions.

XI. COMMENCEMENT AND TERMINATION

This Agreement shall become effective as of/or near March 15th 2018, and shall remain in effect until February 28th 2019. It shall thereafter renew itself automatically for similar periods until either party gives notice of termination in writing by

registered mail at least ninety (90) days prior to the expiration of this Agreement, or any renewal term hereof.

- A.) If either party refuse, fail or be unable to perform or observe any of the terms or conditions of this agreement for any reason other than excused performance reasons stated in Section XII hereof, the party claiming such failure shall give the other party a written notice of such breach. If within (30) days from such notice the failure has not been corrected, the injured party may cancel this Agreement. Lone Star Commissary or CLIENT may cancel this Agreement with 30 days notice if this Agreement is no longer profitable or beneficial. CLIENT may cancel this Agreement for any future fiscal year if the County Commissioners do not approve this Agreement for that future fiscal year. In such event, CLIENT shall promptly notify Lone Star Commissary.
- B.) Until the termination or expiration of this Agreement, Lone Star Commissary shall as soon thereafter as is feasible, remove its software and hardware.

XII. EXCUSED PERFORMANCE

In case performance of any terms or provisions hereof (other than the payment of monies) shall be delayed or prevented because of compliance with any law, decree or order of any governmental agency or authority; either Local, State or Federal or because of riot, war, public disturbance, strikes, lockouts differences with workman, fires, flood, acts of God, or any other reason whatsoever which is not within the control of reasonable diligence said party is unable to prevent, the party so suffering may at its option suspend, without liability, the performance of its obligation hereunder (other than the payment of monies) during the period of such suspension of performance of duties hereunder.


