ORDER REAFFIRMING RESOLUTION CREATING A HOTEL OCCUPANCY TAX

Whereas the BLANCO County Commissioners Court is authorized pursuant to Texas Tax Code, Section 156 to impose a Hotel Occupancy Tax, and

Whereas the provisions of said law allows for the adoption of said tax on a person who, under a lease, concession, permit, right of access, license, contract, or agreement, pays for the use or possession or for the right to the use or possession of a room that is in a hotel, costs \$2 or more each day, and is ordinarily used for sleeping, and

Whereas Owners/managers of hotels located in Blanco County, Texas shall report and pay the amount collected to the Blanco County Treasurer on a quarterly basis, with payment due no later than the last day of the month following the end of a quarter (specifically first quarter taxes collected from January through March are due by April 30, second quarter taxes collected from April through June are due by July 31, third quarter taxes collected from July through September are due by October 31 and fourth quarter taxes collected from October through December are due by January 31).

Whereas, Pursuant to Section 352.004 of the Texas Tax Code, if the owner of a hotel fails to report when required or pay the tax when due as set out in section 1 above, the owner shall pay a penalty of five percent (5%) of the amount of the tax due. If the owner fails to file the report or pay the tax before the 31st day after the date that the report or tax payment was due, the owner shall pay an additional penalty of five percent (5%) of the amount of the tax due. Delinquent taxes and accrued penalties shall draw interest at the rate of ten percent (10%) a year beginning 60 days after the date on which the tax was due.

Whereas the BLANCO County Hotel Occupancy Tax shall apply to all hotels located within the county that are not subject to municipal hotel occupancy, and

Whereas said hotel subject to the BLANCO County Hotel Occupancy Tax shall account and collect said occupancy tax at a time and on a form prescribed by BLANCO County and shall remit said tax and report to the BLANCO County Treasurer;

Now, therefore, be it ORDERED that the BLANCO County Commissioners Court does hereby adopt and impose a Hotel Occupancy Tax effective OCTOBER 1, 2023; and collection shall begin on April 1, 2024, in accordance with the terms heretofore stated, and

Be it further ORDERED that the tax rate shall be SEVEN percent (7%) of the price paid for a room in a hotel.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises herein, it is agreed:


- 1. Owner and County hereby enter into this Agreement for a term beginning March 26, 2024, and ending April 30, 2024.

- 9. This Agreement shall be construed and interpreted under Texas law.







ORDER

CONTINUING A LOCAL STATE OF DISASTER

WHEREAS, on April 8th, 2024, Blanco County, Texas will be in the direct line of a total solar eclipse that will traverse across North America; and

WHEREAS, this event is expected to see the population of Blanco County, Texas, double, if not triple, in size throughout the days leading up to and including the day of the event, with the potential for extreme traffic congestion, strain on first responder organizations, along with city and county infrastructure and potential food, grocery and fuel shortages, threatening the safety of all residents; and

WHEREAS, the Blanco County Judge has determined that extraordinary measures must be

taken to protect the health, safety and welfare of Blanco County residents and visitors that may be impacted as a result of the April 8th, 2024, solar eclipse; and

WHEREAS, the Blanco County Judge, in consultation with area emergency management coordinators, law enforcement officials, and fire and rescue officials, has determined that the potential exists for roads, streets and highways to be stressed to and above capacity during certain times of the event; and

WHEREAS, the potential stress and over-capacity of city, county, state, and federal streets, roads, and highways may create a public safety event whereby law enforcement and fire and rescue officers will be impeded from responding to calls for service; and

WHEREAS, the Blanco County Judge, asks residents of Blanco County to stay at home, if possible, ensure all vehicles are filled with fuel the week leading up to this event, ensure sufficient groceries and supplies are purchased well in advance, and to take all cautionary measures to ensure the safety of all persons and animals in their care.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF BLANCO under § 418.108 OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE;

SECTION 1. That a local state of disaster for public health emergency is hereby declared for BLANCO COUNTY, Texas, pursuant to Section 418.108(a) of the Texas Government Code.

SECTION 2. That pursuant to Section 418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code the state of disaster for public health emergency shall continue until rescinded by the County Judge or Commissioners' Court.

SECTION 3. That pursuant to Section 418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code this declaration of a local state of disaster for public health emergency shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the County Clerk.

SECTION 4. That pursuant to Section 418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this declaration of a local state of disaster continues operations under the Blanco County, Texas, emergency management plan, and authorizes the furnishing of aid and assistance under the declaration.

SECTION 5. In accordance with Texas Government Code §418.173, a person who knowingly or intentionally violates this declaration commits an offense, punishable by a fine up to \$1,000.00 or confinement in jail for a term that does not exceed 180 days.

SECTION 6. That this declaration hereby authorizes the use of all lawfully available enforcement tools.

SECTION 7. That all appropriate County resources are available and may be dedicated to relief efforts relating to this disaster.

SECTION 8. That this declaration shall take effect immediately and shall continue in effect until terminated by the County Judge or Commissioners' Court. Pursuant to this declaration, additional directives may be issued by the County Judge at any time deemed necessary.
