Dear Judge Bray:

SHP has been a proud partner with Blanco County for nearly four years now. We have enjoyed working with the Sheriff's Office and look forward to continued business together in years to come.

With a new contract period approaching, I am writing this letter for the historical record to acknowledge the annual renewal. Beginning in June we will either need to implement an increase in service rates to help us with costs over this next contract year, or, SHP would be willing to waive an overall fee increase on the base contract with the County's acceptance of a change in pharmacy terms going forward.

As mentioned at the time of last year's renewal, our Agreement with Blanco County is set up like many of our older contracts with SHP covering the costs of all routine prescription medications without limit under the base fees. Over time, with SHP treating inmate patients who are coming in sicker, more who are on medications and more on high-cost medications, also to include those on mental health/psychiatric medications, pharmacy costs have become increasingly difficult to accurately predict, to the extent we can no longer fully absorb this item of expense under the base contract without asking customers to work with us in support of a change. A yearly cap of \$3,300.00 will help us keep the base contract priced reasonably, by having a provision in place for the County to assume responsibility for the routine medication costs in the event the annual pharmacy cap is exceeded.

We are proposing new terms to place an annual cap/limit on the routine prescription medication costs. SHP would cover up to \$3,300.00 per annual contract period in routine prescription medication expenses, and the County would be responsible for all amounts in excess of \$3,300.00 (if any excess). SHP's new practice would be to submit invoices to the County for 100% reimbursement of any excess costs. Non-routine, chronic-care medication costs (including biologicals/PPD solution) would continue to be exclusionary items for bill-back to the County, as per the current contract terms. Be assured once more that our Operations and site staff will work as diligently as possible to maintain cost-effectiveness in managing the pharmacy program.

In the alternative, without a cap on the medication costs, SHP would need a 6% annual adjustment on the contract to assure continued delivery of high quality staffing and services in accordance with your expectations.

County Road Repair Grants

Dear Commissioners Court Members:

In the last legislative session, the Legislature appropriated \$250 Million for the County Transportation Infrastructure Fund for 2020 for county road repair grants. The Texas Department of Transportation is responsible for administering these grants. We are attaching materials regarding the administration of this new source of funding for county road repairs.

These materials identify several changes in the TIF Program:

- 1. The formula for purposes of allocation of funds has been changed from 2014, with less emphasis on overweight truck permits (down from 20% to 10%), and more emphasis on direct oil and gas industry related items. This will tend to increase the funding to counties that are actually in oil/gas producing areas and will give less relief to counties sustaining road damage from other types of overweight trucks. Nonetheless, each county received an allocation and is eligible for grant funding.
- 2. Counties will NOT be required to create a County Energy Transportation Reinvestment Zone with this cycle because the CETRZ was abolished in 2017. The grant application does not include this requirement.
- 3. Final rules of administration were approved at the 3/26/2020 meeting of the Texas Transportation Commission.
- 4. The Administrative Minute Order and the estimated initial allocations were released 3/26/2020, and are attached to this letter for your information. Formal notification to each county has been issued by certified mail to the county judge.
- 5. Counties will be able to file their grant applications beginning 4/27/2020 and ending 5/27/2020.

This is a very aggressive timeline and will require counties to be proactive immediately in order to comply with the application requirements. You must have specific road projects identified and cost projections for each road project. You must also include the necessary annual road reports and other necessary documentation of the funding for the local match.

Many counties may be able to complete the TXDOT administrative requirements without outside assistance. However, as in 2014, our firm is offering a program to assist your county in meeting the grant requirements. We will perform these services for a flat rate fee of 5% of the grant allocation, or \$25,000.00, whichever is less. Counties can submit administrative costs for grant reimbursement; this means that the county's unreimbursed local share of this fee would be 1% of the grant amount %, or \$10,000.00, whichever is less. We will not bill for our services until TXDOT has approved the county grant application. Based upon these provisions, your county is entitled to an estimated allocation of \$87,378. In order to receive this allocation, you will be required to provide from current available revenues a match of \$17,475.60. Our fee will be submitted as an administrative cost, and may be subject to payment from the CTIF proceeds. We anticipate our fee to be \$4,368.90 with 80% to be reimbursed by TXDOT.

It is very important that you take immediate actions to address the requirements of the new CTIF grant. Specifically, you must:

- 1. Prepare for each precinct an updated annual road report with special attention to degradation in your county's roads attributable to oil/gas or overweight truck traffic and the need for the grant projects. We have attached a one-page sample report.
- 2. Identify the projects that you propose to implement by use of the CTIF funding.
- 3. Identify the funding necessary to "match" the State CTIF grant, i.e. 20% from the County, unless your county is identified by the Comptroller as an 'economically disadvantaged' county, in which case your funding match will be 10% of the allocated funds. Your county will have a 20% match requirement which must come from available county funds.
- 4. If your county intends to use contractors to perform the work, you will need to prepare specifications and meet competitive bidding requirements. The grant does permit counties to perform the work themselves.
- 5. DO NOT EXPEND ANY FUNDS OR MAKE ANY PURCHASES BEFORE THE GRANT APPLICATION IS APPROVED BY TXDOT. Premature expenditures will not be eligible for reimbursement.
- 6. We will, if retained, assist you with all of these matters.

Should you wish to enlist our assistance in submitting your application for this grant and meeting the administrative requirements, please approve and return the attached retainer agreement for our services. Please contact us if you have any questions.

RETAINER AGREEMENT

	THIS AGREEMENT is made and entered into this	day of,	2020,
by and	between BLANCO County, Texas, hereinafter referred to a	s "Client", and Allison, E	Bass &
Magee	, L.L.P. hereinafter referred to as "Attorneys".		

Recitals

The Client is a political subdivision of the State of Texas. The Attorneys are duly licensed to practice law in the State of Texas and desire to render their professional services for the Client as provided herein.

The Commissioners Court of BLANCO County, Texas, acting in its judicial and executive capacity, finds that the public interest requires the retention of legal counsel to represent the County in the referenced matters.

THEREFORE, the Client hereby engages the services of the Attorneys, and in consideration of the mutual promises herein contained, the parties agree as follows:

Services of Attorney

- 1. The Attorneys will advise and represent the Client in legal and administrative matters as requested by the Client, by and through a majority vote of the Commissioners Court, for consultation and assistance with the 2020 County Transportation Infrastructure Fund (CTIF 2020) grant application and administration of grant funds, and on such legal matters as may be assigned by the Commissioners Court. Services will also include drafting and reviewing of documents, briefing, and any negotiations required for resolution of this matter.
- 2. This Retainer Agreement shall serve as the basis for understanding regarding fees and costs to be charged to the Client, but the subject matter for legal services may only be authorized by an Order of the Commissioners Court.

3. Fees will include any and all necessary research, drafting and reviewing of documents, briefing, and any negotiations required for the proper disposition of any and all matters entrusted to the Attorneys pursuant to this retainer agreement.

Compensation

4. For the services described in Paragraph 1, the Client agrees to pay the Attorneys a sum equal to not more than 5% of the County grant allocation, but not to exceed \$25,000.00 for all services and expenses incurred by the firm. Based on the estimated grant application information issued by the Texas Transportation Commission on 3/26/2020, BLANCO County will receive an estimated award of \$87,378 upon a successful application. The County will be required to provide a match of \$17,475.60 from available county revenues. Our fee will be \$4,368.90. Upon approval of the county application by TXDOT, this fee will be submitted for grant reimbursement as an administrative expense for project administration.

Devotion of Time

5. The Attorneys shall make themselves available for consultation with the Client at reasonable times, at the request of the Client.

Term

6. This agreement shall be effective on the execution hereof by Client and shall continue in effect until the matter has been finally resolved or upon 30 days written notice by either party.
