CONTRACT FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This Contract is made and entered into on this the day of 202 County (hereinafter referred to as Client) and Doucet (hereinafter referred to as Consulta	3, by and between Blanco
and to as consulta	16).

The Client hereby engages the Consultant to perform professional services related to land planning, and real estate development consulting and entitlement, permitting and project coordination on an "as-needed", "per project" basis. The specific responsibilities of the Consultant are outlined under Section I of this Contract.

Section I - Services of Consultant

The Consultant shall provide the following professional services to the Client in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract including engineering services as needed, plat reviews, drainage analysis review, construction plan set reviews, and construction observation services:

- Review of subdivision plats. Doucet will review preliminary and final plats submitted to Blanco County.
 Doucet will issue written comments to applicants noting deficiencies in their applications. Upon the applicant successfully addressing comments, Doucet will prepare a written recommendation for approval of the plat to the Commissioners Court.
- Review of subdivision construction plans and drainage design. Doucet will review construction materials submittals for conformance with the Blanco County Standards and plans.
- Development meetings. If requested by Blanco County, Doucet can be available for virtual or in-person meetings to answer questions of the Court, the public, or developers related to the rules and standards for development.
- Construction observation. Doucet, on behalf of the County, will make field visits to observe subdivision construction and testing.

Section II - Period of Service

A. This Contract shall be effective immediately upon approval by the Client and shall be effective until terminated by either party in accordance with the provisions contained herein below or upon issuance of Blanco County. The Consultant shall provide professional services in accordance with the provisions of this contract on an as-needed basis for the life of this Contract.

Section III - Consultant's Compensation

A. The Client hereby agrees to pay the Consultant at the hourly rates listed below*, billed in quarter-hour increments, excluding reimbursable expenses.

staff anticipated to be utilized on this scope of work. Doucet reserves the right to adjust hourly bill rates from time to time. The above rates are in affect for this scope of services for 2023.

- B. Reimbursable expenses shall be considered those reasonable expenses related to providing professional services to the Client including, but not limited to, travel by Doucet vehicles at standard rates; postage and handling, duplication costs, delivery and courier fees, application fees and other similar professional fees. There shall be a 10% administration fee added to each invoice for reimbursable expenses.
- C. Invoices for services rendered by the Consultant will be provided on a monthly basis. The Client shall pay the Consultant within 30 days of receipt of invoice for services rendered. Late payments shall be assessed a penalty equivalent to 5% of the total monthly invoice due. Late penalties shall be added to the next monthly invoice for services rendered. Each invoice reflecting an overdue amount shall be assessed a late fee for the total amount due.

Section IV - Standards of Performance

- A. The Consultant shall provide professional services in accordance with the provisions of this contract on an as-needed basis for the life of this Contract. The Consultant shall perform its services in a diligent, prudent and workmanlike manner consistent with generally accepted professional practices and standards for firms engaged in similar services and in accordance with the terms and conditions of this Contract.
- B. The Consultant does not represent nor warranty or guarantee the approval of any development project or the work provided hereunder, and Client hereby agrees to the terms and conditions of this contract regardless of the outcome, whether expressed or implied, of any development project.

Section V -Termination

- A. The Client, at its sole discretion, may terminate this Contract for any reason upon 15 days written notice delivered to the Consultant personally or by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- B. Immediately upon receiving said notice of termination, the Consultant shall discontinue any and all services under this Contract and proceed to close said operations under this Contract. The Consultant shall deliver to the Client all documents, files, and data, both electronically and/or hard copy, that have been prepared in connection with the Consultant's work with the Client.
- C. The Consultant, at its sole discretion, may terminate this contract for any reason upon 15 days written notice delivered to the Client personally or by certified mail, return receipt requested.
- D. Immediately upon delivering said notice of termination, the Consultant shall deliver to the Client all documents, files, and data, both electronically and hard copy, that have been prepared in connection with the Consultant's work with the Client.
- E. The Client shall make final payment within 15 days after the Consultant has delivered all documents, files and data as required above.



Section VI – Indemnification and Release

A. The Client hereby agrees to defend, indemnify and hold the Consultant, its officers, directors and employees harmless from and against any and all claims, demands, causes of action, suits and other litigation and related damages, losses and expenses arising out of, or resulting from, the services performed, by the Consultant in its performance of this Agreement. Such indemnity does not include the willful or negligent act or omission of Consultant.

Section VII - Entire Agreement

A. This is a single, integrated Agreement and all requirements hereunder contain the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the matters covered herein. This Agreement cannot be modified except in writing signed by both parties. Any oral or written representations or understandings not incorporated in this Agreement are specifically excluded. This Agreement was mutually drafted and shall not be construed against either party, regardless of authorship.

Section VIII - Severability

- A. The terms, provisions, sections, paragraphs, sentences, clauses, and phrases of this Agreement are severable, and if any phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, provision or term of this Agreement shall be declared unconstitutional or invalid, such unconstitutionality or invalidity shall not affect any of the remaining phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs, sections, provisions or terms of this Agreement but shall be confined in its operation to the specific section, paragraph, sentence, clause, phrase, provision or term that is held unconstitutional or invalid, since the same would have been enforceable without the incorporation in this Agreement of any such unconstitutional or invalid phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph, section, provision or term.
- B. Should the parties agree that the severed portion substantially alter this Agreement so that the original intent and purpose of the Agreement no longer exists, the parties may terminate this Agreement accordingly.

RESOLUTION

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING PROCEEDING WITH ISSUANCE OF CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION AND FURTHER DIRECTING THE PUBLICATION OF NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE COUNTY OF BLANCO, TEXAS COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2023

THE STATE OF TEXAS SCOUNTY OF BLANCO S

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of the County of Blanco, Texas (the "County") has determined it to be in the County's best interest to issue certificates of obligation for paying all or a portion of the County's contractual obligations incurred or to be incurred for constructing, improving, extending, expanding, upgrading and/or developing (i) a public safety facility to include services for STAR Flight, (ii) the County's existing fair and rodeo facilities, (iii) renovations to the County's historic jail, and (iv) payment of professional services in connection therewith including legal, engineering, architectural and fiscal fees and the costs of issuing the Certificates (collectively the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the County has deemed it advisable to give notice of intention to issue the Certificates in a maximum principal amount not to exceed \$3,900,000 pursuant to the provisions of the Certificate of Obligation Act of 1971, Section 271.041 et seq., Local Government Code, as amended (the "Act"), for the purpose of financing the Project; and

WHEREAS, prior to the issuance of the Certificates, the County is required under Section 271.041 et seq., Local Government Code to publish notice of its intention to issue the Certificates in a newspaper of general circulation in the County and on the County's internet website, the notice stating: (i) the time and place tentatively set for the passage of the order authorizing the issuance of the Certificates, (ii) the maximum amount and purpose of the Certificates to be authorized; (iii) the manner in which the Certificates will be paid, (iv) the then-current principal of all outstanding debt obligations of the County; (v) the then-current combined principal and interest required to pay all outstanding debt obligations of the issuer on time and in full; (vi) the maximum principal amount of the Certificates to be authorized; (vii) the estimated combined principal and interest required to pay the Certificates to be authorized on time and in full; (viii) the estimated interest rate for the Certificates to be authorized or that the maximum interest rate for the Certificates may not exceed the maximum legal interest rate; and (ix) the maximum maturity date of the Certificates to be authorized; and

WHEREAS, the meeting at which this Resolution is adopted was open to the public and public notice of the time, place and purpose of the meeting was given, all as required by Chapter 551, Government Code, as amended.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF THE COUNTY OF BLANCO, TEXAS:

- 1. Attached hereto is a form of the Notice of Intention to Issue the Certificates, the form and substance of which is hereby adopted and approved.
- 2. The County Clerk shall cause said notice to be published in substantially the form attached hereto, in a newspaper, as defined by Subchapter C, Chapter 2051, Texas Government Code, of general circulation in the area of the County, once a week for two consecutive weeks, the date of the first publication thereof to be before the 45th day before the date tentatively set for the passage of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the Certificates.

Further, said notice shall be continuously published in substantially the form attached hereto on the City's website for at least 45 days before the date tentatively set for passage of the ordinance authorizing the issuance of the Certificates.

- 3. The County Judge, County Staff and financial advisor and bond counsel to the County are authorized to proceed with preparing the necessary bond and offering documents to effectuate the sale of the Certificates including making application to appropriate rating agencies and bond insurers, if applicable.
- 4. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption. The County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to execute the certificate to which this Resolution is attached on behalf of the County and the Judge, County Clerk, and the County Administrative Assistant are further authorized to do any and all things proper and necessary to carry out the intent of this Resolution including approving appropriate changes to the notice and approving the final form of any Preliminary Official Statement for distribution to the market in connection with the sale of the Certificates.
- 5. The County hereby authorizes the disbursement of a fee equal to the lesser of (i) one-tenth of one percent of the principal amount of each series of the obligations being issued or (ii) \$9,500 per series, provided that such fee shall not be less than \$750, to the Attorney General of Texas Public Finance Division for payment of the examination fee charged by the State of Texas for the Attorney General's review and approval of public securities and credit agreements, as required by Section 1202.004 of the Texas Government Code. The appropriate member of the County's staff is hereby instructed to take the necessary measures to make this payment. The County is also authorized to reimburse the appropriate County funds for such payment from proceeds of the obligations.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO ISSUE COUNTY OF BLANCO, TEXAS COMBINATION TAX AND REVENUE CERTIFICATES OF OBLIGATION, SERIES 2023

NOTICE is hereby given that it is the intention of the Commissioners Court of the County of Blanco, Texas to issue Certificates of Obligation (the "Certificates") of the County in one or more series for the purpose of providing funds for paying contractual obligations incurred or to be incurred for: constructing, improving, extending, expanding, upgrading and/or developing (i) a public safety facility to include services for STAR Flight, (ii) the County's existing fair and rodeo facilities, (iii) renovations to the County's historic jail, and (iv) payment of professional services in connection therewith including legal, engineering, architectural and fiscal fees and the costs of issuing the Certificates. The Commissioners Court tentatively proposes to authorize the issuance of the Certificates at its regular meeting place in the County Courthouse, 101 E. Pecan, Johnson City, Texas to be commenced at 9:00 a.m., on the 27th day of June, 2023. The maximum principal amount of Certificates that may be authorized for the above listed purposes is \$3,900,000. The Commissioners Court presently proposes to provide for the security and payment of the Certificates by a pledge of ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property within the County within the limits allowed by law and from a limited pledge of the net revenues of the County's sanitary landfill after payment of all operations and maintenance expenses not to exceed \$1,000.

The following information is required pursuant to Texas Local Government Code, Section 271.049(b)(4): As of June 27, 2023 principal of all outstanding debt obligations of the County is \$8,460,000. As of June 27, 2023 combined principal and interest required to pay all outstanding debt obligations of the County on time and in full is \$9,947,831. The maximum principal amount of the Certificates to be authorized is \$3,900,000. The estimated combined principal and interest required to pay the Certificates to be authorized on time and in full is \$5,272,462. The estimated interest rate for the Certificates to be authorized is 3.90%. Such estimate takes into account a number of factors, including the issuance schedule, maturity schedule and the expected bond ratings of the proposed bonds. Such estimated maximum interest rate is provided as a matter of information, but is not a limitation on the interest rate at which the bonds, or any series thereof, may be sold. The maximum maturity date of the Certificates to be authorized is August 15, 2039.
